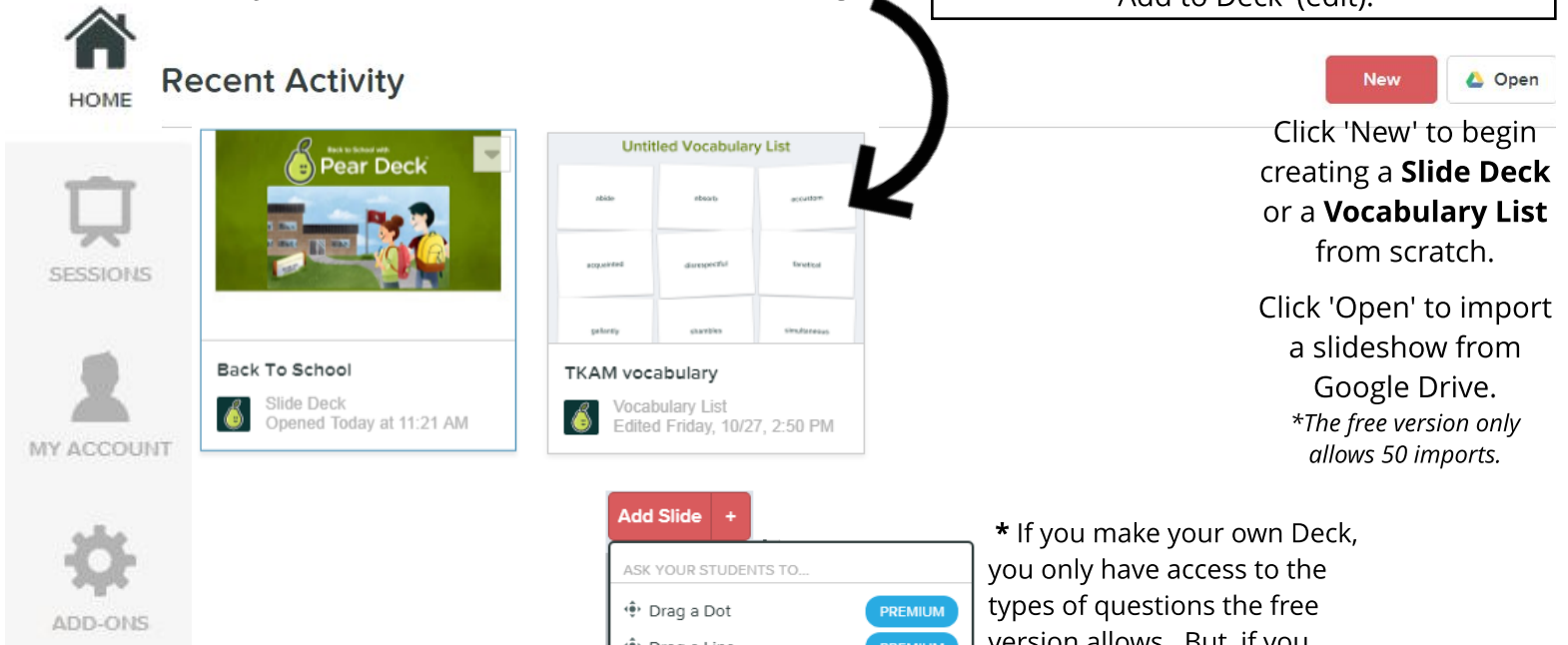
- Go to www.peardeck.com and log-in with Google
- Download the App from the Chrome Store
- Get the Add-on for Google Slides

Great information on how to use Pear Deck



Recent Activity shows all of your Pear Decks or Vocabulary Lists. Click to 'Edit' or 'Start Presenting'.

Takes you to the **Pear Deck Orchard** : TONS of examples by subject!
Find one you like and 'Copy to Drive' or 'Add to Deck' (edit).



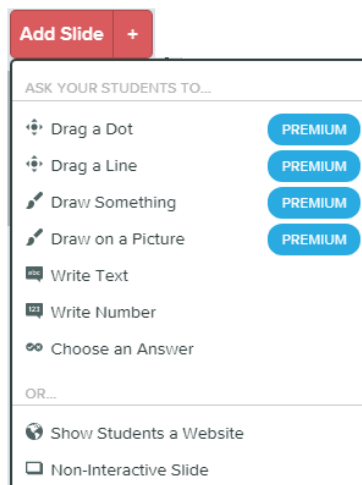
Click 'New' to begin creating a **Slide Deck** or a **Vocabulary List** from scratch.

Click 'Open' to import a slideshow from Google Drive.

**The free version only allows 50 imports.*

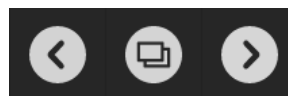
To Create a Deck:

1. Click 'New' and select 'Slide Deck' from the main screen.
2. Name your Deck.
3. Add slides by clicking the red button. Create slides just like you would in PowerPoint or Google Slides.
4. Slides can be "normal" or interactive. Select how you would like students to interact with your slides from the drop down menu.
5. Save and/or start presenting!



* If you make your own Deck, you only have access to the types of questions the free version allows. But, if you choose one from the Pear Deck Orchard, it may have different types of questions than what are available to you with the free version.

Options while presenting:



- Previous/Next Slide
- Slide Navigator



- Project Student Responses anonymously
- Lock Slide so students can no longer answer
- Ask a New Question
- End Session, etc.

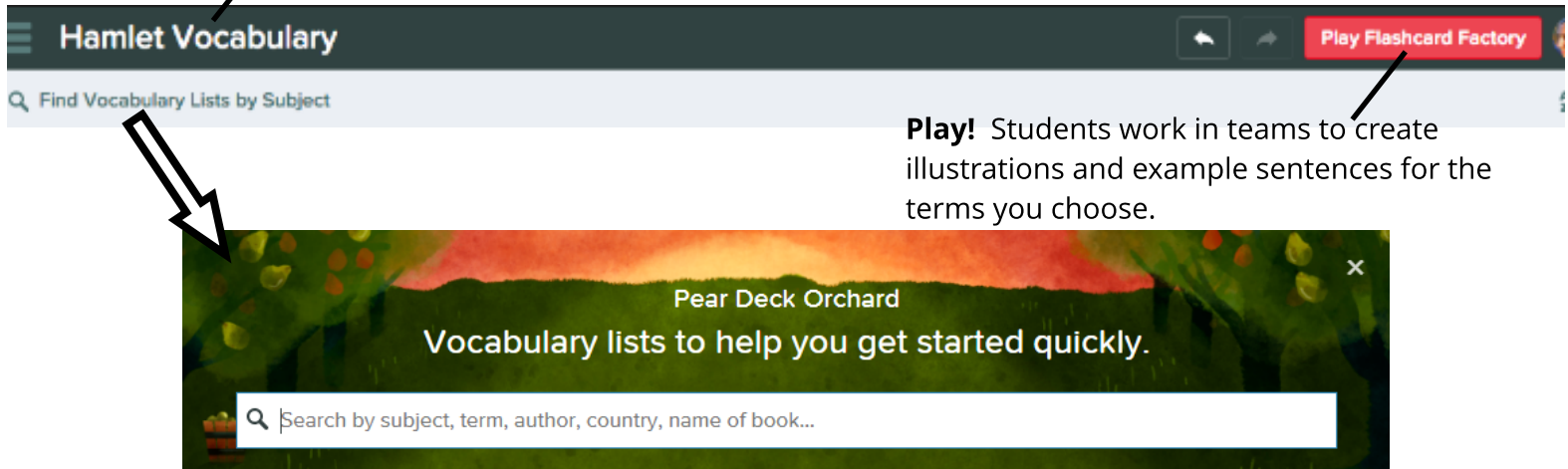

Getting started:

- www.peardeck.com/vocabulary and sign-in with Google
- Select new **Vocabulary List** from your main Pear Deck dashboard

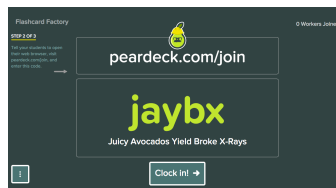
Name your vocabulary list



Play! Students work in teams to create illustrations and example sentences for the terms you choose.

Teacher:

1. Select 'New' Vocabulary List from the main screen.
2. Use your own terms and definitions **OR** search for a set in the Orchard.
3. Click 'Play Flashcard Factory' to use with students.
4. Turn on projector and give students the code to join.
5. When all students have joined, click 'Clock In!'
6. The computer will group students into two teams - you can 'Shuffle Teams' if you choose.
7. Click 'Let's Play!'



Students:

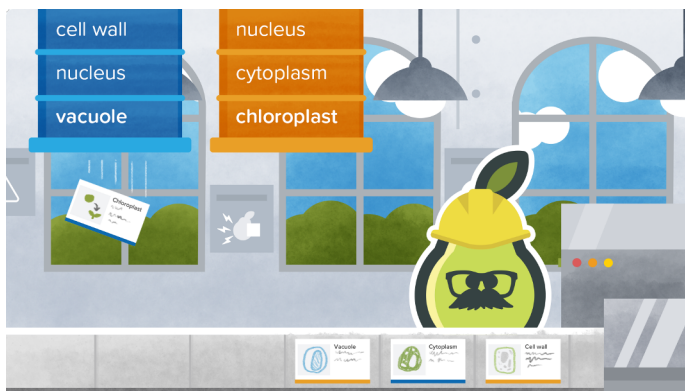
1. The computer splits them into two teams : Day Shift and Night Shift.
2. Teams are further split into small groups that work (and sit) together to draw a picture and write an example for each term.
3. Groups must finish (and submit) both parts - drawing and example - to get their next term.



Together:

1. Once you have a few examples for each term, head to "Quality Control".
2. Teacher can show examples on the projector and everyone can decide whether it's a good/bad example of the term.
3. The team with the most accepted examples WINS!
4. Accepted examples will be included in the final set of flashcards and can be exported to Quizlet.
